The International Women's Day

- Established in 1911
- Originally called International Working Women's Day, celebrated on March 8 every year.
- To bring political and social awareness of the struggles by women worldwide.
- WE, must make the women of the past proud, the women of the present inspired and provide the women of the future with vision.

A Review of Past Activities By the WEC, IEP KC
